Assessment and results

- Candidates undertake a programme of study, normally over a period of 60 hours, depending on the mode of study
- Candidates book their examination for a fee
- Candidates sit two 90-minute examinations comprising of a selection of short-answer questions
- Examinations can be undertaken all year round at selected British Safety Council offices worldwide
- Candidates' scripts are marked by external examiners appointed by the British Safety Council. Results and certificates are issued within six weeks.
